## STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN COLLEGE ACTIVITIES POLICY

## Rationale:

- Students at Edenhope College have the opportunity to participate in many curriculum-related, cocurricular and extra-curricular College activities eg. incursions, excursions, sports events, camps and enrichment programs.
- These activities are an important aspect of the educational programs offered at our school.
- These activities provide an opportunity for students to be physically active, learn and develop skills, build relationships, and broaden their experience and cultural exposure beyond the classrooms of Edenhope College.

#### Aims:

- To encourage and assist students in their positive involvement in all College activities.
- To encourage individual achievement, self-discipline and personal bests.
- To provide recognition to students who meet Edenhope College's expectations of mutual respect, striving for personal excellence and generally 'do the right thing' on a consistent basis in their student lives.

### **Implementation:**

- Participation in College activities will only be available to students whose behaviour, attitude and effort meet the expectations of the College's Student Code of Conduct.
- Students who participate in College activities (as defined above):
  - Demonstrate key College values of mutual respect, fairness, self-discipline and individual achievement;
  - Wear their uniform correctly in fitting with the College Dress Code;
  - o Are up-to-date with their class work and homework;
  - o Are punctual to school and have an excellent attendance record, including attending special College events eg. Swimming and Athletics Sports; and
  - Consistently display sensible and reliable behaviour at school, and travelling to and from school.
- Parents will be notified if their child is in danger of losing their invitation to participate in College activities due to poor/unsatisfactory behaviour, attitude and effort at school.
- The decision to exclude a student from a College activity will be made by the Principal and the relevant sub-school manager, in consultation with the teacher-in-charge of the activity and student's classroom teachers, as appropriate.
